NEW BUSINESS/OPEN ITEMS:


- 1. Appoint task force to review Missions we support, 2-3 people and Pastor.

Next Meeting will be Saturday, June 3, 2017. Meeting closed in prayer by Rick Frey. Adjourned at 11:08 a.m.


