After the wonderful service, we had refreshments downstairs, provided by the Worship Ministry Team. Thank you to everyone that participated in this special event!

2021 OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD PROJECT

A shoebox can be packed for: 2-4 year old girl or boy, 5-9 year old girl or boy, 10-14 year old girl or boy.

Items that **CANNOT** be put in an Operation Christmas Child Shoebox include: candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; war-related items such as

toy guns, knives, military toys or figures or wearable camouflage; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans; Vaseline®; scary items (things that will frighten a child rather than bring joy); liquid paint sets or liquid glue; rubber balls with liquid filling; liquid lip gloss; matches or fire starters; sand/rocks/shells gathered from nature; nail polish; money or play money; baby powder; baking soda; razors; used clothing or used toys. If any of these items are put in the boxes they will be removed when the boxes are inspected before being sent to the children.

These items ARE ALLOWED: playing cards; batteries (in original packaging or with both ends taped); wet wipes or plain alcohol wipes; toy spiders/bugs/snakes; superheroes or other licensed characters; items with company logos; all types of scissors; squirt guns (that don't look like real guns); glow sticks; play dough (store bought); solid stick deodorant; adhesive bandages (non-medicated); eating utensils; marbles; Bibles or other religious literature or symbols.

It is suggested that each box include a "wow" item (doll/soccer ball & manual air pump/stuffed animal/clothing/small musical instrument), personal care items (comb, brush, toothbrush, wash cloth, colorful adhesive bandages, reusable plastic containers, blanket, flashlight [solar powered or hand-crank], school supplies (pencils, small manual pencil sharpener, colored pencils, pencil case, erasers, pens, crayons, markers, notebooks, blank index cards, solar-powered calculator, scissors, ruler, protractor, glue stick, small adhesive tape), clothing/accessories (shirts, pants, wrist watch, underwear, shoes, socks, flip-flops, hat, sunglasses, tote bag/purse, hair bows) crafts and activities (coloring books, puzzles, playdough, stickers, chalkboard & chalk, binoculars, building blocks, tool set, building blocks, jump rope) and a personal note & photo.

OCC also asks for a \$9 donation per shoebox to cover trucking to the processing centers, inspecting the shoebox gifts and prepare them for international shipment, shipping to over 100 countries and once there to the local churches, and gospel materials to train & equip local churches how to share the Good News of the Lord Jesus Christ in a child-friendly way, and "The Greatest Gift" gospel booklets written in the children's language and distributed along with the shoebox gifts. This year, they are asking that the \$9 be donated online, or mailed in. Martha Circle is going to help cover some of this, and will collect the money separately from the shoeboxes. They will then send all the \$9 donations together in one payment/mail-in envelope.

If you decide to pack a Shoebox for OCC, please have it to the church no later than Nov. 7th to give us time to get them to the area collection during the National Collection Week Nov. 15-22.

Administrative Council - MINUTES for September 11, 2021 Meeting

Prayer & Moment of Silence (9-11), Devotion - Rick Frey

Clerk's Report- Joy Sommers: Minutes from the previous meeting were in the Messenger.

Pastoral Search Committee: Pastor Mary's Installation Service - Sunday, Sept. 19th, service starts at 9:30 AM. Pastor Mary said she appreciates everything all of us do.

Financial Secretary - Dawn Frey: General Fund Income Jun-Aug 2020 was \$20,672, for Jun-Aug 2021 was \$18,809.

Treasurer's Report - Mary Ivey: Reports issued - doing good. Moved \$50,000 from checking to savings to get a better interest rate. Comcast - lowered monthly bill from \$151/mo to \$78.45/month. Consumers Energy bills - one from rental house, one for church - Mary updated the contact names on the accounts, as they were outdated.

Worship Ministry Team - Mary Ivey/Joanne: Mary Ivey will be selecting hymns for the months of Sept & Oct. Sept. 5th - Communion, using real bread and juice. Sept. 12th - Grandparent's Sunday (Deacon's do flowers and tribute). This will also be Patriot Sunday (remembering 9-11). Sept. 19th - Pastor Mary's Installation Service, Worship Service will begin at 9:30 am. We will have several dignitaries in attendance. World Communion Day is Sunday, Oct. 3rd. Mary will change the banners to "Go... Proclaim the Good News" and "To All the World". We are going to find a different group to do special music on the July 4th weekend instead of the John & Kate Denner for 2022. Rev. Brian Johnson, ABC-MI Executive Director will visit Ceresco Baptist - Feb. 13, 2022. We will contact First Baptist, Marshall about Thanksgiving & Christmas services for 2021. Will discuss at our next meeting Oct 21st at 4 pm. Reviewed bulletin for changes to the order of worship - changes took place Sept. 5th.

Property Management Ministry Team - Bob Beltz: New faucets in the two upstairs bathrooms. New toilets (handicap 17" height) - not purchased yet. Martha Circle voted to pay the cost. Habitat for Humanity will take the old ones. New dehumidifier in basement. Tightened handrails that were loose. Sink drains - not draining good - may have to remove the walls and change the plumbing. Revised contract at Parsonage (rental), addendum to contract regarding the two dogs there. Rent has never been raised while they have been there. Rent is \$800/mo starting Oct. 1, 2021. It was \$500/month prior. Health Dept - Rick has a certificate for "Cooking for Crowds" to be able to serve food, and is acceptable instead of the other Food Manager licenses we had. Actual Kitchen License is renewed annually, and is current (\$316).

Deacon Ministry Team - Roger Sommers: Communion - resumed using real bread and grape juice. Grandparent's Sunday is 9/12; Joanne Henley, Kay Davis, Roger & Joy Sommers; special music - Donna Ruthruff. Regular meetings with Pastor on Sunday mornings prior to worship service. Looking for volunteers to serve on the Deacon committee.

Nominating Committee - Roger Sommers: Time to get nominees for the 2022 Proposed Slate of Officers. Need a couple of volunteers to serve on the committee with Roger. Proposed Slate will be presented at the next meeting.

Boy Scouts - Seth Bagley is the new Scout Master. Meetings resume Sept. 13th. Meetings will be on Monday nights, like before. Seth will let Dawn know if there are any additional meetings.

Educational Ministry Team - Joy Sommers: Sign-up sheet for volunteers to do Children's Time. Children's Sunday School-Per Quarter-Marcy will have items prepared in case others cover the class. May request a class helper if more than 5 Children in attendance. May need to start next grade level class. Junior Church, On-Hold. Activities-Fall Gathering/Christmas-to be determined.
