This Book Is Worth Your Time

While searching through used books at the Tekonsha Labor Day Yard sales last year, I came across a book that is touching my heart and I'd like to share a tiny bit of what I've found so far. The book titled "God Came Near" by Max Lucado reminds us that the Creator of everything came to earth in human form. Christians know this and everyone around the world celebrates Christmas. Some even remember it's a celebration of God's human birth. But is it simply surface knowledge? In Lucado's book, he truly brings Jesus' human existence into personal reality.

For instance, God chose the common name Jesus for His human form. In Lucado's book one of the chapters is titled, "Just Call Me Jesus." In that chapter, one of the paragraphs reads, "He was touchable, approachable, reachable, And, what's more, he was ordinary. If He were here today you probably wouldn't notice Him as He walked through a shopping mall. He wouldn't turn heads by the cloths He wore or the jewelry He flashed. 'Just call me Jesus,' you can almost hear Him say."

Lucado admits in his book that some may think it sacrilegious to humanize God. However, God became human just like each of us. In one chapter titled "When God Sighed", Mark 7:31-37 is quoted. Most of us have no doubt passed right over that little word, "sigh." But Jesus sighed. Haven't we sighed many times but to even give thought to the fact that Jesus did, wow.

Have you ever thought about the fact that Jesus left the carpentry shop for you? Max Lucado brings to life the possibility of Jesus standing in the doorway of His earthly father's carpentry shop one last time and what He might have been thinking as He turned and walked away.

Now, I haven't finished reading the book. It's one that I'm not willing to squeeze in during commercials on a TV program. Or, while other distractions interfere. This is a book, similar to the Bible, that deserves uninterrupted focus. Don't get me wrong, it's not anywhere near as important as the Word of God, the Bible, but the scripture references in Lucado's book have a way of coming to life in an everyday personal level.

The chapters are short and it isn't a big book. Hopefully, you will pick it up at the library or book store. I think it will be well worth your time.
