Rock Builders vs. Sand Builders

"Therefore whoever hears these sayings of Mine, and does them, I will liken him to a wise man who built his house on the rock: and the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house; and it did not fall, for it was founded on the rock." - MATTHEW 7:24-25

PONDER THIS

There are two things necessary for a firm foundation: hearing and heeding the Word of God. That's where we begin to separate the rock builders from the sand builders.

Suppose the devil were to ask to join your church. Someone sits down with him and asks, "Mr. Devil, we want to know if you are orthodox or not. Do you believe in one God? Do you believe Jesus Christ is the Son of God? Do you believe He was born of a virgin? Do you believe He died on the cross? Do you believe He walked out of the grave?" He would answer all those things correctly, saying yes to each one.

They might then ask how he feels called to serve. I imagine he'd be glad to do anything you ask. He'll be an usher. He'll sing in the choir if you want him to. He'll be glad to preach. He'll be glad to get into that organization and work.

But there should be one final question. "Are you willing to bow your knee to the lordship of Jesus Christ?" And he will not do that. Many people think just because they give a mental assent to the facts of the Gospel and just because they are working in the church in some way, they are going to Heaven. But they have no more faith than the devil himself because they have never surrendered to the lordship of Jesus Christ.

What does it look like to live out your faith? What does it look like to ascent to the facts but refuse to bow to the Lordship of Jesus?

Where is it difficult for you to surrender to Christ's lordship? How can you submit this area of your life to Him?

PRACTICE THIS

Ask a trusted friend how he or she has seen you live out your faith and ask for honest feedback on where that person has seen you struggle to live out the Word.





Love One Another (John 13:34-35)

A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are My disciples, if you love one another.

Jesus gives the disciples a command to love one another and then sets an expectation for what that looks like. In the same way He has loved them, they are to love each other. That means that it isn't just a sentimental feeling, but a love that's willing to go to any lengths for each other. And it's this style of self-sacrificial love that will prove that they're Jesus's disciples.

This same love that Christ demonstrated for others is expected of us. People are hungry to belong and be loved. And when they see that love shared among believers, it makes them that much more willing to respond positively to the good news.

John 15:9-10 New International Version

⁹ "As the Father has loved Me, so have I loved you. Now remain in My love. ¹⁰ If you keep My commands, you will remain in My love, just as I have kept My Father's commands and remain in His love.

Agape—Our Love for God

We love Him because He first loved us. 1 John 4:19

Recommended Reading: 1 John 4:7-12

The New Testament was originally penned in Greek, and there are four different Greek words translated love. The word agape represents the essence of divine love—God's own special love. It's the love God has for us and the kind of love He gives us for Himself and others.

Osborne Gordon, a nineteenth-century British pastor, said, "There is no soul so pure and heavenly that it can throw back upon God all that love which He lavishes upon us. God loves us infinitely more than it is possible for us to love Him; but whatever feeble flame of love is kindled in our hearts and goes up as a sacrifice to Him, we are only giving Him of His own."

That's a good description of agape. The greatest command within Scripture is to love the Lord our God with all our heart, mind, and soul (Matthew 22:37). It's the Lord Himself who gives us the agape that allows us to do that. Let His love set your heart on fire and return it like sparks flying upward to Him.

Our love of [God] is nothing more than His love to us, reflected back upon Him, the source of love.
